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The 2024 Altman Weil Legal Technology Survey predicts that virtualization will become the standard model for US law firms within the next decade.

Clients are voting with their feet, according to the 2024 Thomson Reuters Legal Consumer Survey, with 72% preferring virtual options due to convenience, cost-effectiveness, and faster service.

The ABA highlights certain ethical obligations that are implicated more than others when attorneys work remotely – specifically the duty to practice competently, to adequately supervise those who work for you and to preserve confidentiality.

ABA Model Rule 1.1 emphasizes specific ethical obligations for remote attorneys.

Tasks requiring in-person appearances or paper filings.

Clear policies for remote work:

Secure connections, data storage.

Regular check-ins with supervised staff:

remain paramount regardless of location. Stay informed, adapt practices, and ensure competent supervision for a successful remote legal practice.

Technology working against remote paralegals:

Some big law firms will not require their lawyers to return to the office. In fact, according to a Bloomberg article from June 1, 2021, around 40% of employees would have rather quit their job than return to the office.[1] A survey conducted by Above the Law revealed that to get resistant lawyers to give up remote work and return to the office, they would need a 30% pay increase. Lawyers love the flexibility that they receive from remote work.

Technology Working Against Remote Paralegals:

Cloud-Based Collaboration Tools:

Platforms such as Microsoft Teams, Slack, or legal-specific solutions like Clio can facilitate seamless communication, file sharing, and real-time collaboration, mitigating the isolation felt by remote paralegals.

Document Management Systems:

Implementing advanced document management systems enhances the organization and accessibility of legal documents. Features like version control and secure access contribute to streamlined workflows.

Virtual Legal Research Platforms:

Remote paralegals can leverage sophisticated legal research tools such as Westlaw or LexisNexis to conduct comprehensive and efficient research, ensuring high-quality support to legal teams.

Solutions

In Q2 2021, core overhead expenses had risen enough to dampen some work-from-home savings. In the next year they had increased by 4.7% (not far off from the PCE Core inflation rate of 5.0% during 2022). This category of expenses is also the most challenging to firms at the current point, as this category has become the source of the bulk of operating cost growth, contributing 4.3 percentage points to the average firm's 7.9% overhead expense growth. (2)

Remote paralegals must adhere to Cybersecurity Best Practices (CBP) to prevent hacking or unauthorized access. Implementing and enforcing security measures is crucial.

Ensuring that remote paralegals can securely access legal systems and databases without compromising sensitive information.

Legal technology spending will increase to approximately 12% of in-house budgets by 2025, a threefold increase from 2020 levels.

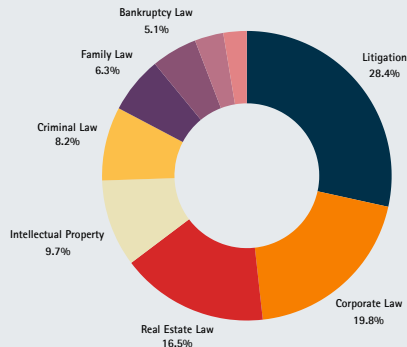

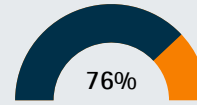
Statistics for US Paralegal Practice Area Segregation and Most Popular Hiring Practices



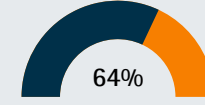

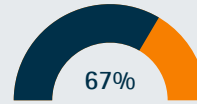
